In the same way, but inversely, and still under the Law of Duality, the middle of the subdominant minor is lowered a flat. F#67 1/2 in the key of E minor is F64 in the key of A; B45 in the key of A is B?42 2/3 in the key of D; E60 in the key of D is E?56 8/9 in the key of G. This lowering by flats of the subdominant **middle in the minors**, responsive to the raising by sharps of the dominant middle in the majors, goes on through all the twelve minor keys.¹ [Scientific Basis and Build of Music, page 62]
